All about the roundabout

Welcome to your latest A39 Falmouth Gateway e-newsletter.

We all know how important tourism is to our economy, so the summer holidays are always a welcome time of year, bringing with them the huge influx of visitors that so many businesses in the county depend upon.

However, with the positives comes the additional pressure on our road infrastructure. While we always do our utmost to minimise disruption, regardless of the size of job or the time of year, it is inevitable that works of the size and nature being undertaken as part of project will have some impact, no matter how hard we try. The increased amount of traffic at this time of year will only add to any already existing bottlenecks or slow areas, and no amount of traffic management will be able to offset this.

With that in mind, we would ask that, if your journey is important and you have to be there at a specific time, monitor traffic updates, and give yourself plenty of extra time to get where you need to be.

What's happening...

We have been creating new access points to properties and Four Cross garage, including the footpath and associated drainage.

Small works will continue at night time in the coming month, which will complete the garage's entrance and this phase. Final surfacing will take place in November.

There will be four-way traffic lights in place from 7pm in the evening from Thursday 31 August.

This will allow us to reconfigure the temporary roundabout while working within its confines.

We will also be connecting the existing drainage to a new manhole within the new central island.

The Penryn road will continue to function as it currently is, with the other three arms on a single lane approach.

From Monday 4 September, we begin construction of the drainage, footpath and kerbing will commence on the Falmouth and Redruth roads. This will involve five to seven weeks of night work, with four-way traffic lights in place each night.

The temporary carriageway will then be removed and preparations made for the new surface.
