There is a slight trend of theft in the area at the moment. We have had some reports of theft of granite mushrooms so any expensive garden ornaments should be kept as safe as possible. If you are able to I would advice marking your ornaments so that they are distinguishable if they are taken or go missing.

We have also received reports of people taking muscle fish from Bar beach on the Helford river. If you are unaware, this beach is owned by the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and is leased to the people that own the Oyster Farm. The owners of the Oyster farm own the rights to the fish that live on the beach which they are using as a conservation site for fish that naturally breed there. If you see this happening then please report it to the Oyster farm and if they feel it necessary they can report it to us as a theft.
